The Hamilton County Department of Health quarantines students per ORC 3707.11. SLSD assists with contact tracing on a case-by-case basis. "Test & Stay" and "Test & Play" are both in place currently. As we have said since early last year – the positive case numbers in our schools will reflect what is in the community. Paper 3-ply surgical masks are far more effective than most cloth masks / gators. We have these available in each of the schools.

Important: When we see significant numbers of students and / or staff out due to COVID, we will shift to either universal masking or remote instruction. Like last year, we will do this by grade, then building to start. It is important that families are prepared for either scenario. Last week, we were extremely close at several schools. We monitor our numbers by the minute, each day. Most all of last week's spike were attributed to positive family members over break.

\*Also of note, this time of year, if your child is ill, please err on the side of caution and keep them home. There are other contagious illnesses that are not COVID that are making their rounds currently.
