<sup>\*</sup> Includes carry overs from previous week. Positive cases = isolated for 10 days; close contacts / quarantine = 7, 10, or 14 days. The Hamilton County Department of Health quarantines students per ORC 3707.11. SLSD assists with contact tracing on a case-by-case basis. When students are masked up / or vaccinated, they are NOT subject to quarantine. Close contacts also have the option to mask up for 14 days post contact with a positive case and if they remain symptom free, can stay in school during the 14-day duration. Youth vaccines for children (5 – 11) are available now.

Important: When we see significant numbers of students and / or staff out due to COVID, we will shift to either universal masking or remote instruction. Like last year, we will do this by grade, then building to start. It is important that families are prepared for either scenario. When there is universal masking in schools, students do not miss face to face instruction due to quarantine. As we have said numerous times, our #1 priority is safety and keeping kids learning IN SCHOOL.
